**GRAND TRAVERSE COUNTY
SENIOR CITIZEN SERVICES
MILLAGE PROPOSAL
FOR IN HOME SERVICES**

This proposal will allow Grand Traverse County through its Commission on Aging to continue to provide in-home services to senior citizens age 60 years and older. This proposal is a renewal of a previously authorized millage.

Shall the limitation on the total amount of taxes that may be levied against all taxable property within Grand Traverse County be renewed and Grand Traverse County be authorized to levy up to and including 0.5 mills (\$0.50 per \$1,000 of taxable value) for a period of six (6) years beginning 2017 through 2022, inclusive, for the purpose of providing in home services for senior citizens age 60 years and older, by the Grand Traverse County Commission on Aging? If approved and levied in full, the millage of 0.5 mills will

generate an estimated \$ 2,310,264 to be disbursed to the Grand Traverse County Commission on Aging for services for senior citizens when first levied in 2017.

By law, tax increment revenues from this millage will be distributed to governmental units within Grand Traverse County that capture property taxes, which are the City of Traverse City Downtown Development Authority, Grand Traverse County Brownfield Redevelopment Authority, Village of Kingsley Downtown Development Authority, Village of Fife Lake Downtown Development Authority, and Interlochen Downtown Development Authority.

Shall the proposal be adopted?

SENIOR CITIZEN SERVICES FOR SENIOR CENTERS

GRAND TRAVERSE COUNTY SENIOR CITIZEN SERVICES MILLAGE PROPOSAL FOR SENIOR CENTERS (2016 Election)

This proposal will allow Grand Traverse County to continue to provide funds for Grand Traverse County Senior Centers. This proposal is a renewal of a previously authorized millage.

Shall the limitation on the total amount of taxes that may be levied against all taxable property within Grand Traverse County be renewed and Grand Traverse County be authorized to levy up to and including 0.1 mill (\$0.10 per \$1,000 of taxable value) for a period of seven (7) years beginning 2016 through 2022, inclusive, for the purpose of providing funds for Grand Traverse County Senior Centers? If approved and levied in full, the millage of 0.1 mill will generate an estimated \$462,053 to be used for Grand Traverse County Senior Centers when first levied in 2016.

By law, tax increment revenues from this millage will be distributed to governmental units within Grand Traverse County that capture property taxes, which are the City of Traverse City Downtown Development Authority, Grand Traverse County Brownfield Redevelopment Authority, Village of Kingsley Downtown Development Authority, Village of Fife Lake Downtown Development Authority, and Interlochen Downtown Development Authority.

TRAVERSE AREA DISTRICT LIBRARY MILLAGE PROPOSAL

This proposal is to renew the Traverse Area District Library expiring millage at its current level in the amount of .9548 mills beginning with the December 2016 tax levy in order to provide funds for the Traverse Area District Library for the next 10 years. A millage was approved by the voters in 1996 in the amount of 1.1 mills for the Traverse Area District Library. The 1996 millage was reduced by law over the years to the millage rate requested by this proposal. There will be no increase in the millage rate as a result of this proposal.

Shall the expired previously voted annual tax rate which may be levied against all taxable property within the Traverse Area District Library district, Grand Traverse County, and a portion of Leelanau County, Michigan, of 1.1 mills reduced to 0.9548 mills by the required millage rollbacks be renewed in the amount of 0.9548 mills (\$0.9548 per \$1,000 of taxable value) and levied for 10 years, beginning 2016 through 2025, inclusive, the revenues of which will be disbursed to the Traverse Area District Library to be used for all district library purposes authorized by law? If approved, 0.9548 mills will generate an estimated \$4,247,553 for the Traverse Area District Library when first levied in 2016.

By law, a portion of the millage will be disbursed to other governmental entities that capture property taxes within their jurisdictions. These are the City of Traverse City Downtown Development Authority, Grand Traverse County Brownfield Redevelopment Authority, Grand Traverse County Land Bank Authority, Village of Kingsley Downtown Development Authority, Village of Fife Lake Downtown Development Authority, and Interlochen Downtown Development Authority.
